Topic: All About the Environmental Rating Scale
Core Competency: 2 hrs. Environment and Curriculum

Target Audience: All age groups Course Group: Intermediate

Summary: Family Child Care, Facilities, and Centers will discover the many benefits of using the Environmental Rating Scale. Participants will learn about the scale and how to score their child care environment using

this instrument which was developed by Thelma Harms, Debbie Cryer and Richard M. Clifford.

Topic: Big Body Play

Core Competency: 1 hr. Child Growth and Development; 1 hr. Health, Safety and Nutrition

Target Audience: Adult Course Group: Intermediate

Summary: Big body play supports children's physical development, but it also supports the development of children's social awareness, emotional thinking, and language skills. During this session participants will be taught safe and appropriate activities to promote big body play in their centers, facilities, and homes.

Topic: Brain Development in Infants

Core Competency: 2 hrs. Child Growth and Development **Target Audience:** Infants and Toddlers **Course Group:** Basic

Summary: Participants will discuss how the brain develops from birth, what stress can do to infants and toddlers in their care, and how social relationships help build the brain. Risk factors, warning signs and what to look for in an effective program will also be discussed.

Topic: Child Care Emergency Awareness Training Core competency: 12 hrs. Health, Safety and Nutrition Target Audience: Adults Course Group: Advanced

Summary: This 6 week module class will help providers be prepared for the unexpected by receiving infor-

mation on necessary supplies, crucial safety advice, and special care that may be needed.

Topic: Come Read to Me

Core competency: 2 hrs. Environment and Curriculum WVELSF: English Language Arts: Standard 2

Target Audience: Adults Course Group: Intermediate

Summary: When we open a book to read, we open opportunities to bring the book to life! Participants in this professional development session will find out how to choose books for a variety of age groups, how to incorporate props and overall, how to have fun with reading in their centers, facilities, and homes.

Topic: Introduction to WVELSF Pre-Kindergarten- West Virginia Early Learning Standards Framework Core competency: 2 hrs. Program Management

Target Audience: Adults (keeping children in the pre-kindergarten age group 36 weeks old to age 5) Course

Group: Basic

Summary: Participants will learn an overview about the West Virginia Early Learning Standards Framework. Discussion will include the purpose, areas of development covered and how to incorporate the standards into curriculum planning. Follow up Technical Assistance will be offered for additional STARS credit to help with incorporation into curriculum.

Topic: Making Friends One Day at a Time

Core Competency: 2 hrs. Family and Community Relationships

Target Audience: Adult Course Group: Intermediate

Summary: How do you make a friend? What makes you a good friend? How do we say "sorry" when we hurt someone's feelings? In this session participants will look at strategies to help guide their children in their everyday interactions with their peers and ways to make and keep friendships.

Topic: Mandate to Report: Child Abuse and Neglect Core Competency: 2 hrs. Health, Safety and Nutrition

Target Audience: Adults Course Group: Basic

Summary: As mandated reporters of suspected child abuse and neglect, you have a legal and moral responsibility to report any suspected abuse. Caregivers needing child abuse and neglect training should register for this class. It is open to all providers.

Topic: Mind in the Making

Core Competency: 12 week module classes with 45 hours Child Growth and Development (see p. 6 for more information.

Topic: Sleep Safe in Child Care

Core Competency: 2 hrs. Health, Safety and Nutrition

Target Audience: Infants Course Group: Basic

Summary: Participants of this session will discuss the latest SIDS (Sudden Infant Death Syndrome) research and best practices for keeping children healthy and safe while sleeping.

Apprenticeship for Child Development Specialist

ACDS is an apprenticeship program for professionals working a minimum of 20 hours a week in the early childhood field. The program combines 4 semesters of coursework with on the job training. Participants of ACDS include employees of child care, family child care, after school, head start, home visitation, and public pre-k and kindergarten. Classes are offered in counties throughout the state by ACDS certified instructors. Participants that are registered on the WV STARS Career Pathway will receive 45 hours of WV STARS credit upon completion of each semester.
