From September 30, 2024, to September 30, 2027, Save the Children Federation, Inc. will use DOL WORC funding to increase **workforce participation** and **qualifications** through training, credential programs, higher education pathways, and supportive services.

CREDENTIAL PATHWAY

Participants will receive access to online **Child Development Associate** (CDA®) courses and financial assistance to complete their credential. The CDA is the most widely recognized credential in early childhood education.

HIGHER EDUCATION PATHWAY

Financial assistance to pursue a **bachelor's or associate degree in child development or related field** from an accredited college or university.

- •Up to \$2,300 for AA and \$5,500 for BA in tuition support per semester

- •\$550 barrier reduction stipend annually
