

# **April - June 2024 Training Topics and Descriptions**



# Courses marked with this symbol are courses required to meet the voluntary, Child Care Credential/Specializations criteria.

<u>All About Down Syndrome:</u> Child Growth and Development; Environment and Curriculum (Beginner)
In this training by Meredith Lester, you will learn about Down Syndrome. Participants will learn how to help children with Down Syndrome and meet their needs in the classroom. At the end of the session participants will be able to understand what Down Syndrome is and how to accommodate children with Down Syndrome in their childcare setting.

<u>Diving into Diversity:</u> Family and Community Relationships; Environment and Curriculum (Beginner) In this training by Meredith Lester, you will learn about diversity and inclusion. Participants will learn about how to add diversity to the childcare environment. At the end of the session participants will learn how diversity is positive for all children and families.

<u>Early Childhood Environmental Rating Scale - 3 (ECERS-3):</u> Environment and Curriculum; Professionalism and Leadership (Beginner)

This course, by Sami Cochran, provides an overview of the Early Childhood Environment Rating Scale, 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition (ECERS-3) including purpose, content, scoring, and tips for observing. This tool is used in Center-based programs caring for children 3 – 5 years old.

<u>Early Childhood Positive Behavior Intervention Support (ECPBIS):</u> Child Growth and Development; Child Observation and Assessment; Environment and Curriculum (Advanced)



In this training by Meredith Lester, you will learn about Early Childhood Positive Behavior Intervention and Support. Participants will learn about positive ways to support the children in their care and manage behaviors they see in their programs. At the end of the session participants will be able to understand that positive intervention is an effective tool for managing behavior. You will receive materials throughout the

module series to help you implement the new strategies you will learn. You must pre-register on STARS or contact Meredith Lester at 304-262-1584 and must attend all sessions for a total of 8 hours.

<u>Early Learning Standards Framework: I/T with Lesson Planning:</u> Child Growth and Development; Child Observation and Assessment (Intermediate)



This six-hour module series with Ashley Cleaver is broken into 3, 2-hour sessions. These courses will provide an opportunity to explore the WV Early Learning Standards Framework for Infants and Toddlers by focusing on two developmental domains each session. Each session will discuss the purpose, content, application,

and benefits of the learning standards, as well as how to incorporate each domain into a lesson plan. By the end of the module series, participants will have a detailed understanding of how the Early Learning Standards work and how to incorporate them into a complete lesson plan for infants and toddlers. Upon completion of the module series, participants will be eligible for up to \$250 in resources directly related to the WV ELSF: I/T.

<u>Early Learning Standards Framework: Pre-K with Lesson Planning:</u> Child Growth and Development; Child Observation and Assessment; Environment and Curriculum (Beginner)



In this 3-part module series with Sami Cochran that is geared towards Pre-K teachers, you will receive an indepth look at the WV Early Learning Standard Framework. You will learn about each of the content areas, domains, clusters, and standards and then how to connect them to a lesson plan. As a group, we will

brainstorm ways teachers can meet the goals in the standards. At the end of the series, teachers will have a completed lesson plan to take with them to reference when planning future lessons and activities. This series is appropriate for providers working with children over 36 months of age. Upon completion of the module series, participants will be eligible for up to \$250 in resources directly related to the WV ELSF: Pre-K.

# Identifying Environmental Hazards 2: Health, Safety and Nutrition

This training with Renee Stonebraker discusses how to eliminate environmental hazards found in or around buildings, including plastics, arsenic, and asbestos.

<u>Infant/Toddler Positive Behavior Intervention Support (ITPBIS):</u> Child Growth and Development; Child Observation and Assessment; Environment and Curriculum (Advanced)



This class by Carrie Frasch will teach providers the importance of building relationships with infants and toddlers and to identify various strategies that can be used to support positive behaviors. Participants will learn to: understand social/emotional development, behaviors, form sustaining relationships, understand

the importance of environmental design, structure transitions, routines, expectations, and engaging activities to do with infants and toddlers. You will receive materials throughout the module series to help you implement the new strategies you will learn. You must pre-register on STARS or contact Carrie Frasch at 304-262-1584 and must attend all sessions for a total of 10 hours.

### <u>Planning Your Professional Growth:</u> Professionalism and Leadership (Beginner)



This training by Jaime Price focuses on professional growth of early education providers and how to identify goals for the future.

# **Quality Counts:** Professionalism and Leadership (Beginner)



Why does high-quality childcare matter? Because the need for quality childcare has never been greater! But what does it look like in our state? And how can we help? Through group discussion with Quality Improvement Specialist, Jaime Price, and the use of media, early childhood educators will examine

program supports that are necessary to achieve and maintain quality childcare and the important role they play within the process.

<u>School-Age Environmental Rating Scale (SACERS):</u> Environment and Curriculum; Professionalism and Leadership (Beginner)

This course, by Sami Cochran, provides an overview of the School-Age Environment Rating Scale (SACERS) including purpose, content, scoring, and tips for observing. This tool is used for center-based classrooms for children 5 – 12 years old.

<u>Teaching Children to Resolve Conflicts:</u> Child Growth and Development; Environment and Curriculum (Beginner) Children are going to engage in conflict, for reasons such as two children wanting to play with the same toy or a child feeling like something is unfair. In this training with Carrie Frasch, we will discuss techniques you can use to help children prevent and effectively resolve conflicts.

# The Growing Brain: Various Core Knowledge Areas (Beginner)



This 7-session series delves into research in brain development and strategies for childcare providers to support the growing brains of children, birth to 5 years old. The crucial development of the growing brain is one of the most important topics in early childhood development. Research on the topic is exploding,

underscoring the need for early childhood professionals to stay up to date on brain development and strategies to best support the growing brains of children, birth to 5 years old, in their care.

# <u>Utilizing the Environmental Rating Scale to Achieve Higher Program Quality:</u> Professionalism and Leadership; Administration and Management (Beginner)



This session with Jaime Price will include an overview of the most recent versions of the Environment Rating Scales as well as information on how to use the information from the self-assessment to improve program quality through goal setting and the creation of action plans and professional development plans.

This training will be applicable to staff and administrators of child care centers, facilities, and child care homes.

# West Virginia Elements of Family Child Care Series: Various Core Knowledge Areas (Intermediate)



The WV Elements of Family Child Care Series was developed for Family Child Care and Facility providers to improve the quality of early childhood education. This seven-module series focuses on topics ranging from becoming a professional and organizing your day to what children are learning and how to work with

families. You must attend all 7 sessions to get credit for this course. Contact your local TRAILS team for more information.

<u>What's Your Implicit Bias?</u>: Family and Community Relationships; Professionalism and Leadership; Administration and Management (Beginner)

This session with Jessie Lambert will define implicit and explicit bias, identify your own biases, and how bias can impact your work in the classroom with children and families.
