Topic: ACEs 101

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *1hr. Child Growth and Development*

WVELFS: All Domains

Target Audience: Adult

Tier: Basic

Summary: During this one-hour professional development the participant will be introduced to the concept of Adverse Childhood Experiences through awareness and education.

This training will be in person.

Topic: Act, Don't React

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *1hr. Child Growth and Development & 1hr. Environment and Curriculum*

WVELFS: All Domains

Target Audience: Adult

Tier: Intermediate

Summary: This two-hour training focuses on creating a calm, predictable, and engaging classroom environment using proactive behavior support strategies. Staff will learn how their actions directly influence children's behavior and emotional regulation. Instead of reacting to unsafe behaviors, participants will learn to anticipate triggers, teach clear expectations, model calm behavior, and provide positive redirection. **This training will be in person.**

Topic: Being a H.E.R.O: Showing Honesty, Empathy, Respect and Open-Mindedness for Children

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *1hr. Environment and Curriculum & 1hr. Professionalism and Leadership*

WVELSF: Social Emotional Development

Target Audience: Adults

Tier: Intermediate

Summary: Children learn through their environment. We want children to develop the social/emotional skills of showing honesty, empathy, respect and open-mindedness (acceptance) towards the adults and peers in their lives. In this developmental session we will learn that it takes the adults in the lives of children to help them learn these necessary skills. Participants will learn ideas and strategies to become the Hero's in the lives of the children they encounter by using the skills of honesty, empathy, respect and open-mindedness. **This training will be in person.**



Topic: Family Child Care Positive Behavior Instructional Support (FCCPBIS)

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *1hr. Professionalism and Leadership, 2.50hrs.*

Environments and Curriculum & 2.50hrs. Child Growth and Development

WVELSF: Social Emotional Development **Target Audience:** Adult **Tier:** Intermediate

Summary: FCCPBIS modules consists of three, two-hour sessions focusing on social and emotional support in family childhood settings. The modules are based on the Pyramid model, which follows the public health model of prevention, promotion and intervention. To receive 6hrs. of STARS credit all modules must be completed and a technical support visit be completed. **This training will be in person.**



Topic: ITERS-3 (Infant Toddler Environmental Rating Scale)

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *2hrs. Environments and Curriculum*

Target Audience: Adult Caregivers of Infant & Toddlers

Tier: Intermediate

Summary: This Course is an overview of the Infant/Toddler Environmental Rating Scale ITERS-3. Participants will learn how to use the ITERS-3 to improve environments and interactions for infants and toddlers in the classroom setting. **This training is online.**

Topic: Mending Broken Hearts

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *1hr. Child Growth and Development & 1hr. Family and Community Relationships*

WVELSF: Social Emotional Development

Target Audience: Adult

Tier: Intermediate

Summary: Many children are exposed to traumatic life events which can change the way they view their world. Reactions to these events will depend upon the severity of the trauma, their personality, the way they cope with stress and the availability of support. Participants will learn strategies that can support the child as they learn to cope. Learn to be the "soft place" for children to land when facing loss such as losing someone they love, a parent who incarcerated, or any difficult life situation. **This training will be in person.**

Topic: Spreading HOPE

Core Knowledge and Competencies: *.75hrs. of Child Growth and Development*

and .75 hours of Family and Community Relationships

WVELSF: All Domains

Target Audience: Adults

Tier: Intermediate

Summary: The HOPE training will cover the effects of ACEs on health outcomes, the importance of positive childhood experiences, and the research showing their mitigating effects on ACEs as well as the biological basis for these effects. We will introduce the four building blocks of HOPE and discuss type 1 vs. type 2 thinking. The presentation will present some ideas of how to incorporate the HOPE Framework into practice. **This training will be in person.**

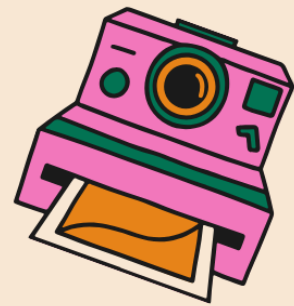

Training Topic	Summary
Communicable Diseases	Tips for minimizing the spread of infection in programs as well as information about common communicable diseases.
First Aid for Minor Injuries	Kids frequently experience bumps, scrapes, and falls during active play/exploration. This presentation includes some basic first aid instructions for those minor injuries as well as when you should seek professional medical treatment.
Diabetes in Child Care	This training includes information from American Diabetes Association Safe at School campaign regarding the basic needs that children with diabetes need throughout the day.
Summertime Safety	This training includes information about sun, water, and bug safety.
Medication Administration	Participants will be introduced to safe medication handling and administration practices. This training is required for providers to administer medication to children in the childcare setting.
Seizure Disorders	Information about the different types of seizures and how to assist someone who is having a seizure.
Morning Health Checks	Explanation about what a morning health check is as well as how one is conducted.

WV Child Care Credential



The Division of Early Care and Education understands the importance of the work you do, and it wants to help produce the best caregivers and childcare programs possible for West Virginia families. With that in mind, the Division of Early Care and Education has created a voluntary program, the West Virginia Child Care Credential, that recognizes individual childcare providers who go beyond the requirements of State licensing and registration regulations for training, education, and experience.

The four major goals of the Credential Program are to:

- Help develop a professional workforce qualified to provide care for young learners
- Improve your status and compensation
- Recognize your professional learning and ongoing education toward new innovations in child care and early learning
- Give you a structure for growth

Here is the list of trainings for the general credential:

- ⇒ The Growing Brain
- ⇒ Early Learning Standards Framework Overview Or WV Early Learning Standards Framework Overview
- ⇒ Pre-Service Training- Basic Health and Safety in Childcare
- ⇒ Making a Difference: Mandated to Report: Responsibility to Prevent Child Abuse and Neglect (must have been attended after 2018)
- ⇒ WVIT Professional Development Program: Ethics (*onDemand course*)
- ⇒ Medication Administration (must have attended in the last three years)
- ⇒ Understanding ACEs (Adverse Childhood Experiences) ACEs 101
- ⇒ RR Spreading HOPE: Healthy Outcomes from Positive Experiences

If you see this symbol next to a listed training, it indicates that the training meets the requirement for the Child Care Credential. Specific requirements are necessary to receive the credential.

Late registrations will not be accepted.

ACDS will no longer accept late or incomplete registrations. Registration deadlines are shared on the home page of the ACDS website and on the ACDS Facebook page. It is the responsibility of each student to complete the registration process by the deadline. Registration requirements are:

- Orientation (semester the student is entering only, i.e. semester 2)
- Semester Application form (formerly known as registration form)
- Participation Fee (\$25.00 submitted via PayPal by student/employer)

ACDS will no longer contact students requesting information to complete the registration process. Students can check on their registration status by contacting ACDS **before** the registration deadline. Any student attending class without completing the registration process will be dismissed.

Important Announcement!



WV STARS Pathway to Earnings

WV STARS is updating how Pathway to Earnings applications are processed beginning with the April 2026 enrollment period. These changes are intended to ensure fairness and consistent distribution of available funding.

What's Changing

- **Denied applications cannot be resubmitted during the same enrollment period.** Denied applicants will be placed on a list in the order their original application was submitted.
- **If funding remains at the end of the enrollment period, WV STARS will begin contacting denied applicants – following the original submission order- to allow them an opportunity to submit a corrected application.**
- Applicants contacted during this phase will have **72 hours** to fix errors and resubmit all required documentation.
- This process will continue until **all funds are depleted.** WV STARS will notify all denied applicants once funding is exhausted.

What This Means for Applicants

- **Submit a fully complete application the first time.**
Double check that the application is signed, that you have submitted the right documentation, and that your renewal requirements have been met.
- **If your application is denied, prepare your corrections immediately.**
Review your denial email carefully so you can resolve any issues and be ready if you receive a chance to resubmit. Review Pathway to Earnings resources, how-to guides, and checklists for additional guidance.
- **If contacted to resubmit your application, act fast!**
You have just 72 hours to submit a completed application and documentation. Failing to respond will forfeit the opportunity and you will need to wait until the next enrollment period.
- **Denied applicants will be contacted once funds are fully depleted.**
At this point, all denied applicants will be eligible to reapply during the next enrollment period.
